b) 'Varna is no longer practical in today's world.'
Evaluate this view. [15]

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 a) Explain the importance of the festival of Holi in shaping Hindu identity. [15]

b) 'Festivals based on mythical events are no longer meaningful today.'
Evaluate this view with reference to Hinduism. [15]
