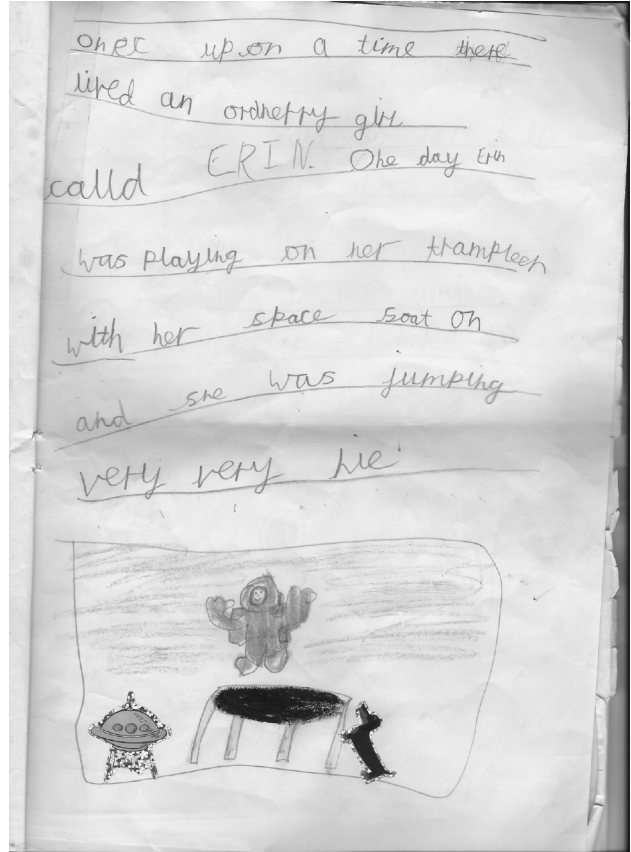
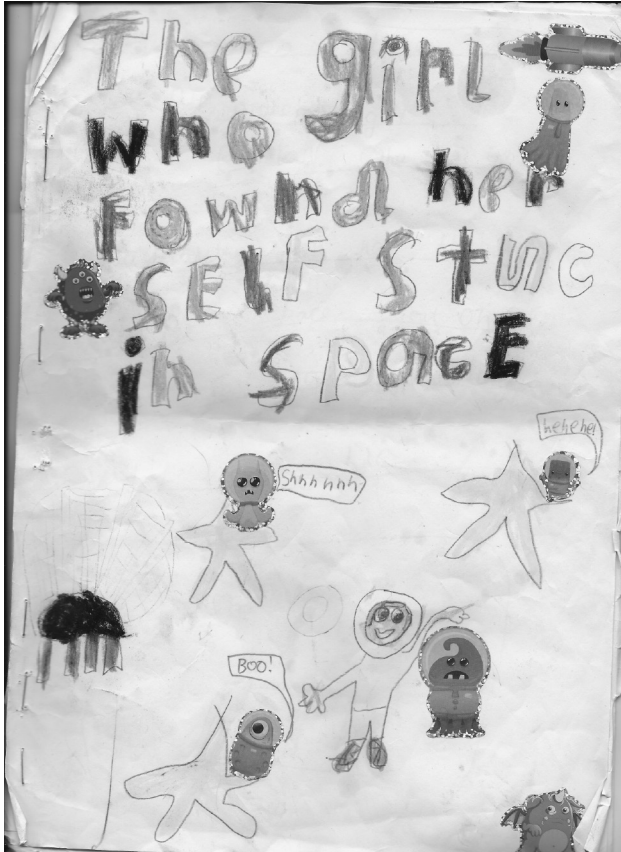

Text B is a transcript of Lucie (aged 2 years and 1 month) interacting with her mother. It was recorded in the family home, where her mother is filming Lucie playing with her toy oven and plastic coins.

[Lucie puts some toy pasta in the toy oven]

M: put pasta in it? **okay**

L: she squidge it

M: oh does it need squidging? **Okay**

[Lucie opens the toy oven and pokes/pushes on the food]

M: does mummy have two minutes to wait or five minutes?

[Lucie closes the door of the toy oven]

L: five minutes /mɪnet/

M: **okay**

[Lucie picks up a toy pizza with removable toppings and starts pulling them off and putting them in a toy bin]

L: go in the bin over /əʊ/ here /bɪə/

M: oh are they going in the bin over there? **okay** are they not nice?

L: yeah
