1. The images below show how a sports footwear manufacturer has changed the way trainers are packaged.



- (a) Using **two** of the Six Rs of sustainability, identify how designers have made effective changes to previous methods of packaging trainers. 2 x [2]

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- (b) The logo shown is part of the sports footwear manufacturer's policy for producing the new packaging.



- (i) State what this logo represents: [1]

- (ii) Explain why this may be important to the consumer of the trainers. [2]

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- (c) Explain the effect the new packaging has on the manufacturer's ecological footprint. [3]

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2. The kitchen product pictured below has been developed to help cut vegetables during food preparation.



- (a) Describe how the designer could use CAD (Computer Aided Design) when developing the kitchen product. [2]

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- (b) A one-off prototype of the kitchen product is produced. Explain what the designer would do with this prototype prior to launching full-scale production. [3]

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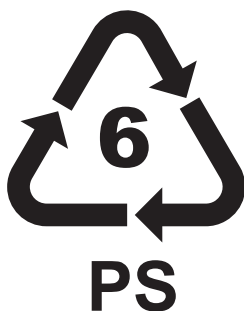
- (iii) The aluminium alloy has been spray painted for a chrome effect. Describe why this is a suitable finish. [3]

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- (e) The manufacturer uses a fully automated continuous production system to produce the tripod stick. Explain how this may create winners and losers. [5]

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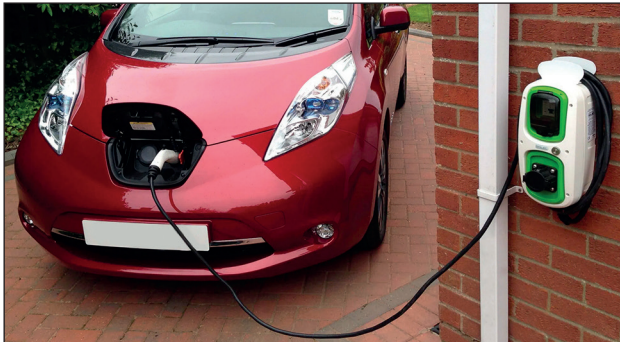
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4. Many homeowners are now being encouraged to install electric car charging points as shown below.

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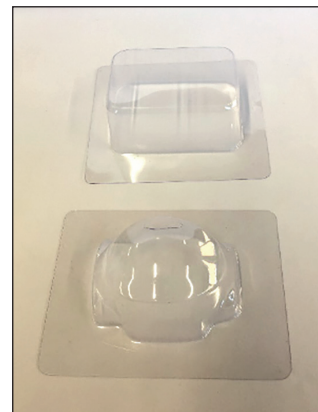
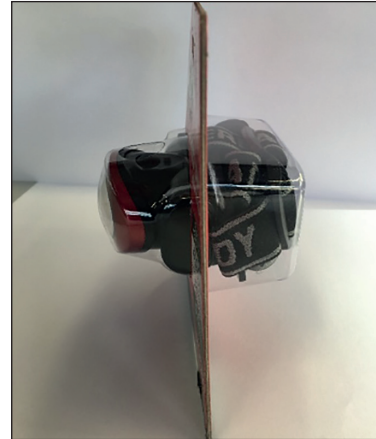
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6. The headlamp below has been produced to allow users to wear a light source for a range of activities.
