 - (b) Outline and evaluate sociological views on the benefits of family diversity. [33]

OPTION 2

Sociology of Health

- 3 (a) Identify and explain two ways that health may be seen as culturally relative. [17]
 - (b) Outline and evaluate the view that mental illness is caused by structural factors in society.

- 4 (a) Identify and explain two ways health professionals work to benefit their own interests. [17]
 - (b) Outline and evaluate sociological explanations for patterns of ill health related to social class.

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OPTION 3

Sociology of Religion

- 5 (a) Identify and explain two ways in which churches differ from other religious organisations. [17]
 - (b) Outline and evaluate the functionalist view that the role of religion in society is to promote consensus. [33]
- 6 (a) Identify and explain two ways that religiosity is related to gender. [17]
 - (b) Outline and evaluate the view that the increase in religious pluralism is a sign of secularisation. [33]

OPTION 4

Sociology of Youth

- 7 (a) Identify and explain two reasons why youth subcultures are important to their members. [17]
 - (b) Outline and evaluate the view that social class has the greatest impact on pupils' experience of school. [33]
- 8 (a) Identify and explain two ways that youth deviance is related to gender. [17]
 - (b) Outline and evaluate functionalist explanations of the role of youth culture in society. [33]
