- 3. France, 1515-1547
 - (a) **Explain why** there were financial problems in the reign of Francis I.

- 4. Spain in the reign of Charles V, c. 1516-1556
 - (a) **Explain why** there was rivalry with France during the reign of Charles V. [24]
 - (b) How far did finance have the **most significant impact** on Spain in the period 1516-1556?
