Cultures vary a great deal. Cultural differences can be demonstrated through language, clothing or symbols and different cultures can have values and norms that are very different to the ones we have been socialised to accept in the UK. The norms and values of a culture may change over time. For example, in the UK smoking is becoming unacceptable whilst divorce has become acceptable. We are socialised into our culture through **agencies of socialisation**.

- (a) With reference to the item and your own knowledge, explain the meaning of the term agencies of socialisation. [5]
- (b) Using material from the item and your own knowledge, describe and explain how any **two** agencies of socialisation can influence an individual's norms and values. [10]
