COMPULSORY QUESTION

WELSH HEALTH SURVEY 2014

The 2014 Welsh Health Survey collected data on health and lifestyles from a REPRESENTATIVE sample of 15,000 adults. Households were selected from the Postcode Address File and a structured interview was initially administered to one adult in each household. Self-completion questionnaires were then given to all adults in the household to complete. Children were also given self-completion questionnaires although an adult completed them on behalf of younger children. Adults were asked to give their consent for the researchers to access their medical records.






USE OF SOCIAL NETWORKING SITES BY AGE 2014
