Read the following item and answer each part of the following question.

Gang membership and teenage offending

Smith and Bradshaw (2005) undertook a **longitudinal study** to explore gang membership and youth offending. The study used a wide range of research methods including self-complete questionnaires with young people, conducted annually to identify changes and patterns. This was followed by semi-structured interviews, for depth and detail with a sub-sample of young people. At the same time, a sample of teachers and parents completed questionnaires. The researchers also examined records of social work reports and children's hearings (a type of youth court). Smith and Bradshaw concluded that rates of gang membership were higher in more deprived areas and among one parent families.
