A scientific survey of young runaways

In 2005, Rees and Lee carried out a survey of 11 000 young people aged 14 to 16 to find out what proportion had run away from home for at least one night, what happened to them and why they had run away. The study consisted of a **representative sample** of young people aged 14 to 16. They were selected from four or five secondary schools in 16 different areas of the country. Rees and Lee used a questionnaire for the study, which students were asked to complete on their own.

The authors also researched previous studies about young runaways. This included a study published in 1999. Rees and Lee decided to use similar methodology to the 1999 study, as this would allow them to compare how the situation had changed over the last seven years.

Rees and Lee took ethical issues very seriously and so provided each school and student with clear statements to explain what the research was about and how it would be used, also explaining that their identity would be kept anonymous.
